AAI Foundation celebrates World Disability Day in Mumbai

On 3rd December 2017, the AAI Foundation in Mumbai organised an event for Visually Impaired (VI) people to celebrate World Disability Day (WDD).

Disability Day, or the International Day of People with Disability, has been promoted by the United Nations since 1992 with the objective of encouraging a better understanding of people affected by a disability, together with helping to make people more aware of the rights, dignity and welfare of disabled people, as well as to raise awareness about the benefits of integrating disabled persons into every aspect of life, from economic, to political, to social and cultural.

The event initiated by the AAI Foundation involved the distribution of folding white canes to 72 eligible beneficiaries at Smt Kamla Mehta Blind School at Mumbai. The programme started with the lighting of the ceremonial lamp by the Chief Guest, optometrist Yogita Rajgandhi, followed by the Vice President felicitating her. Later, Mr Jeevan Chavan gave an introduction of the AAI Foundation and explained the significance of the white cane. Also present on the momentous occasion was the president of the Nari Samman Sanghathan from Mumbai.

Speaking on the occasion, Yogita Rajgandhi stressed on the importance of WDD and shared her views on disability. Following this, a team from Samay National News channel interviewed Ms. Rajgandhi and the same was aired on television.

The event came to a close with the singing of the national anthem by the visually impaired group. All the participants also enjoyed the refreshments served at the event.
